## 4.2 Entry procedure

Entries must be submitted in accordance with GR D.12. - D.22.

An electronic entry application (Internet) will be accepted on the organisers' website <a href="www.racrmc.org">[www.racrmc.org</a>]. An electronic entry application must be confirmed by way of personal signature by the competitor by the latest at administrative checks. A change of competitor is permitted up to the close of entries. Only the competitor entered in the event will be allowed to make this request.

#### 4.3 Contract with the Event

The submission of an entry, whether online or by Post, establishes a contract with the Roger Albert Clark Rally Motor Club Ltd once it has been acknowledged, full payment must be made of the Entry Fee in accordance with these regulations. Any entrant failing to make full payment will be reported to Motorsport UK for breach of contract and withdrawal of Competition Licence until all outstanding fees are paid. GR.C.1.1.13.

#### 4.4 Entry Eligibility

The National event is open to Motorsport UK and Motorsport Ireland International with a National licence competing in cars which are eligible to compete.

The Interclub events are open to all fully elected members of Roger Albert Clark Rally Motor Club Ltd, and members of clubs affiliated to:

- Association of North East Car Clubs
- Associations of Northern Car Clubs
- Scottish Association of Motor Sports Clubs

Interclub event drivers must hold an RS Interclub - Stage Rally (UK only) licence or higher, or Motorsport Ireland equivalent. Interclub event Co-drivers must hold an Interclub status licence or higher, or Motorsport Ireland equivalent.

Where applicable an entrant's licence must also be held.

All events have also been inscribed on the National Competitions with Authorised Foreign Participation (NCAFP) Calendar 2024.

Licence holders from other FIA recognised ASN's will be allowed to compete if they have approval from their own ASN.

- 4.5 Number of competitors accepted and vehicle classes
- 4.5.1 The number of competitors shall be limited to 180 starters on each day across the events in Art 1.2. The minimum is 90. Only the first 15 Reserves will be published on the Entry List.

The minimum for each class for Awards is 5.

Should any of the above figures not be reached, the organisers reserve the right to amalgamate classes or cancel the event.

Process for accepting entries:

- 10 entries will be reserved for foreign competitors.
- 40 entries will be reserved for Championship Registered Contenders as at 1<sup>st</sup> June 2024 and these places will be held until 31 August 2024 when any contenders who have either not paid their deposit or any entries not taken up to 40 will be open for a reserve entry.

A list of accepted entries with paid deposits will be published on Monday 24th June 2024.

Should the remaining entry be oversubscribed by this date, acceptance of entries will be determined as follows:

- 20 entries allocated at the organiser's discretion.
- The remaining 110 entries will be determined giving preference to competitors (drivers)
  who have previously started a Roger Albert Clark Rally Motor Club Ltd promoted or
  organised event the greatest number of times.

All remaining acknowledged entries will be placed on a reserve list subject to SR:D15.1.1.

Entries may be submitted as follows:

To secure an entry on the event a fully completed entry form must be provided with an initial non-refundable deposit payment of £250.00 towards the Entry Fee. All entries received will be acknowledged within seven days, this acknowledgement does not constitute acceptance of, or a contract for an entry on the event.

The favoured method of submitting an entry form is on-line via the Rallies.info system but entry forms may also be sent by email or post.

A second instalment of £1,000.00 must be paid before the 1<sup>st</sup> August 2024 to keep the entry as accepted. If this instalment is not received on time this entry will be cancelled and the next reserve entry will be promoted to a full entry.

ALL accepted entrants must have paid the full entry fee by the 28th October 2024.

Entrants wishing to embargo any information must contact the Clerk of the Course prior to submitting the entry form.

## Entry Raffle

All entries received and paid in full by the 31<sup>st</sup> July 2024 will be entered into a draw and the winning entry will have 50% of their entry fee (£1,125.00) refunded. The draw will take place at the Annual Awards night in February 2025 and paid thereafter.

Each crew member must be members of the Roger Albert Clark Rally Motor Club Ltd to allow them to compete on the event. This is a requirement of HM Revenue & Customs. Membership is £15 per person and expires 31 December 2024. All monies from membership go towards the promotion of Motor Club activities.

#### 4.8 Withdrawal of Entry and refund of fees

Withdrawal of any entry must be made in writing to the Entries Secretary. The sending of an email does not confirm that an entry has been withdrawn. A confirmation email must be received from the Organisers for the withdrawal to be valid.

The initial £250.00 deposit is non-refundable for all accepted entries.

Additional fees will be refunded as follows:

- Entries withdrawn prior to 28<sup>th</sup> October 2024 will be refunded all fees above the initial deposit paid. This will be returned prior to the event.
- Entries withdrawn between 28<sup>th</sup> October and 15<sup>th</sup> November 2024 will be refunded all additional fees paid less a further £200 administration costs. This will be repaid after the event but before 31<sup>st</sup> December 2024.
- No refunds will be issued for withdrawal of entries after the 15th November 2024.

Entries not accepted will be refunded their deposit. Acknowledged reserve entries withdrawn prior to 1st August 2024 or failing to gain a full entry will be refunded their deposit. Acknowledged reserve entries withdrawn after 1st August 2024 will be refunded their deposit less a £100 administration fee.

In the event that the rally is abandoned or postponed, entrants will have fees repaid less a maximum figure of £500.00 administration cost.

Should it be necessary to cancel the event due to legal requirements or other unforeseen circumstances, the actual administration expenses incurred will determine the exact amount of refund. The Organisers and or Promoter are not liable for any further consequential losses incurred by prospective competitors because of event cancellation.

The Organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry.

Entrants **must** state on their entry form the FULL ADDRESS including any post code where they require any documents to be sent by the Organisers.

All relevant identification plates, advertising decals and numbers, along with service and any requested additional packs will be available to collect prior to the event in Carlisle, date to be advised. If not collected, then the documentation can be collected from Scrutineering. These will NOT be posted.

## 5. Insurance Cover

## 5.1.1. Organiser's Arrangements

The organisers have made arrangements to insure entrants and drivers against third party risks while taking part in such parts of the rally as are held on private lands or roads specifically closed for the purpose. This insurance cover will come into effect from the start of the event and will cease at the end of the rally or at the moment of retirement, disqualification or exclusion.

## 5.1.2. Entrants and Driver Requirements

Vehicles must have a valid motor insurance policy which provides as a minimum, Third Party Liability cover that complies with the Road Traffic Act. This can be either, by extending an existing motor policy to cover the event, or, by purchasing additional cover, providing under the Event Road Section Scheme as an adjunct to an existing motor policy. If a competitor has an extension to their existing policy, they will be required to sign a declaration that the cover complies with the requirements of the Road Traffic Act. Any responsibility for a fraudulent or misleading declaration about existing cover lies with the competitor.

If a competitor wishes to purchase additional Road Section cover via the organisers then they can do so prior to the event providing they comply with the following:

- is aged 19 years or older
- has held a full UK / EU driving licence for a minimum of 6 months OK
- has no more than 6 conviction points on their licence and no bans of any kind OK
- has had no more than 1 fault claim in the last 3 years
- do not have the Third-Party Extension cover on their existing motor policy
- the vehicle has a valid MOT and taxed for the road, unless exempt from doing so

Anyone aged less than 19 years old will also be accepted at the same price should their codriver be a more senior member of their family or over 25. Any competitor who falls outside these parameters may be offered cover at equivalent terms or an agreed price, if approval from the Appointed Insurance Broker has been obtained by the event organisers, prior to the event. Approval can be sought by Event Organisers sending an email to the <a href="mailto:contact@reis.co.uk">contact@reis.co.uk</a> and provide the Drivers' name and date of birth, the date they passed their driving test and full details of any motoring claims and/or convictions.

Additional cover provided by this scheme is only effective whilst the vehicle is actively competing in the event and remains under the control or direction of the event organiser(s). Cover will cease immediately if you are precluded, excluded or retire from the event.

The Event Road Section scheme is underwritten by First Underwriting Limited who are authorised and regulated by the Financial Conduct Authority (FCA No 62485) and are registered in England and Wales (No 07857938). Registered Office: Level 15, The Gerkin, 30 St Mary Axe, London, EC3A 8EP

## 7. Tyres

## 7.1 Year Book

All tyres must comply with Section L of the 2024 Motorsport UK Yearbook. Please note the restrictions imposed by Motorsport UK GR R48.5.1 – R48.5.15. Studs, chains or non-skid attachments are NOT PERMITTED (Motorsport UK GR R48.5.1).

Hand cutting of tyres is not allowed.

#### 7.2 Special requirements

In accordance with GR R.48.5.11, the approved maximum quantity of tyres per competing car for the event will be 10 tyres in the first 45 miles. An additional two tyres may be used at each additional service halt, therefore the maximum number of tyres allowed for each event is:

Rally Anglo Caledonian 26 Tyres
Anglo Rally 10 Tyres
Caledonian Rally 10 Tyres

In the event of an extreme weather event, the Clerk of the Course may request the Motorsport UK Steward to suspend the tyre allowance on the grounds of safety.

#### 8. Fuel

All type of fuel must follow FIA Appendix J Art. 252.9. and GR J.5.15.4.

## 8.1 Fuel Ordering procedure

The onus is on the competitor to order their fuel before the rally – the event organisers will not be involved in this process in any way.

#### 8.2 Closing date for ordering fuel

Fuel order closing date is 17.00 GMT on 1 November 2024.

## 9. Reconnaissance of Special Stages

Unauthorised pre-event reconnaissance, practicing or testing over the Special Stages used on this event is FORBIDDEN.

Any Competitor or their agent observed on Forestry England or Forestry and Land Scotland land without the relevant permission, within the area covered by the maps specified (being OS Landranger 78, 79, 80, 85, 86) in these Supplementary Regulations after their publication, will be refused a start or disqualified from the results as appropriate. The only exception to this regulation will be for people who live on or whose employment causes them to travel along part of the route used on the event, or an organised event utilising the said route.

If a stage route amendment is required after subjective route notes are issued, competitors will be given the route via an Ordnance Survey Map of either 1:50,000 or 1:25,000 scale. **No** amended subjective route notes for the re-route will be issued.

#### 10. Administrative checks

10.1 Traditional (In Person) Signing On will take place.

## 11. Scrutineering, Sealing and Marking

11.1 Scrutineering, venue and time

Cars may be presented at scrutineering by a representative of the team. See programme (SR Art. 3)

- Historic Rally Vehicle Identification Form / FIA Historic Technical Passport (where applicable)
- Car Registration Documentation
- SOS / OK board (A4 format)
- Small spill kit, in accordance with GR K.3.

The installation of the tracking system will be checked at scrutineering.

Competitors wishing to carry an in-car camera may do so in accordance with GR J.5.21, and the installation will be checked at scrutineering. Any competitor using an in-car camera must supply the organisers with a copy of the footage on request. The commercial rights to all video and sound material recorded during this event remain the property of the organisers.

11.1.2 Timetable for scrutineering

See programme (SR Art. 3)

- 11.2 Special Requirements
- 11.2.1 Mud flaps

It is **mandatory** to fit transverse mud flaps in conformity with GR R.48.1.2.

#### 11.2.2 Windows

Use of tinted windows is not authorized in accordance with Article 253.11 "Windows/nets" of Appendix J of the FIA International Sporting Code and GR R.48.1.10.

## 11.2.3 Drivers' safety equipment

All items of clothing including helmets and FHR (Front Head Restraint) intended to be used, e.g. HANS devices, must be presented for scrutineering. They shall be checked for compliance with Motorsport UK Yearbook Section K.

#### 11.2.4 Noise Level

The organisers will conduct static sound tests prior to the start.

For all cars, noise tests will be conducted in accordance with GR R.4.1 and J.5.18. All competitor vehicles must pass these tests, which will allow for a maximum of 100 dBA at 4500 rpm, using the 0.5 metre test.

## 11.2.5 Special National Requirements

For all classes, the Technical Regulations of the 2024 Motorsport UK Yearbook shall apply.

#### 11.2.6 Installation of the Safety Tracking System

In association with RBI Sport Geotraq, the rally will operate a mandatory GPRS/GSM safety tracking system that will enable the speed and position of each competing vehicle to be monitored and logged. Before the start, all cars will be fitted with a tracking device prior to scrutineering. The tracker will remain active throughout the event. This must be retained in the car until the finish of the event, when it will be removed by the system providers. Further information will be available in the final instructions.

Should you retire from the event, please return your tracking device to Rally HQ. Failure to return the tracker or returning the tracker in a damaged state will result in financial penalties outlined in the document "DAMAGE / NON-RETURN CHARGES FOR GPS/SATELLITE TRACKING EQUIPMENT" on the Digital Notice Board. If the tracking device is not returned or payment has not been made to the supplier for loss or damage, the crew will be reported to Motorsport UK under Article C.1.1.13 and your competition licences will be suspended until payment is made or the undamaged tracking device is returned.

#### 11.2.7 Auxiliary Lights

Cars entered in Historic Category 1 to 4 and FIA Classes inclusive may not be fitted with gas discharge bulbs or optic bulbs. Only H type bulbs are allowed

Cars entered in Historic Category 1 and 2 may have a maximum of six (6) forward facing beams excluding side lights. Cars entered in Historic Category 3, 4 and European FIA Class may have a maximum of eight (8) forward facing beams excluding side lights.

The maximum diameter of any auxiliary lamp to be not more than 199mm in diameter. Any auxiliary lamps outside the above specification (but must be H bulbs), apply to the clerk of the course and chief scrutineer for permission for use.

Cars entered in other Vehicle Groups in Classes I to N inclusive shall be allowed to have auxiliary lights in accordance with the 2024 Blue Book.

## 12. Other procedures and regulations

12.1 All Competitors will start from MTC 1, Borderway Mart, Carlisle. (\* #)

## 12.2 Ceremonial start procedures and order

The event will run all Historic, Historic 4WD and 2 wheeled drive cars first on the road in reverse seeded number order followed by a 5 minute gap then the remaining 4 wheeled drive cars in anticipated performance order.

Crews will be re-seeded at the start of Leg 2 with regard to their finishing position on the previous leg but preserving the overall running order of classes on the event (Art:8.3). The Organisers hold the right to restart any crew in a position other than their finishing position on the previous leg and no communication will be entered into regarding this. Starting times for the next leg will be published on the Virtual Notice Board as soon as practicable at the end of each day and where possible.

#### 12.3 Permitted early check-in

Early check-in in accordance with the provisions of GR R.30.3.3 is permitted at the final control of each leg. Competitors arriving early must have their due time entered on the Timecard; those arriving later than their due time must have their actual time of arrival entered.

## 12.3.1 Control Opening Times

All controls will be open 15 minutes before the due time of Car '0' and close 31 minutes after the due time of the last Competitor still running, having taken into account any delays (Motorsport UK GR R31.2.5. & R31.2.6). The controls will be staffed for one hour before Car '0' until the sweeper car has visited the control.

## 12.4 Start procedure on Special Stages

The electronic start procedure is as follows:

30 Seconds: RED light will be displayed.

15 Seconds: RED and AMBER lights will be displayed.

10 Seconds: RED light will go out.

5 Seconds: AMBER Countdown 5-4-3-2-1

START TIME: GREEN light goes ON. 5 Seconds after start time: GREEN light goes out.

The system is electronically coupled to a start line detection device that records any situation where the car leaves the start line ahead of the correct signal. In the event of failure of the electronic system, the timekeeper will count down aloud: 30 seconds; 15 seconds; 10 seconds and the last 5 seconds one by one, and then raise a flag or hand for the competitor to start the stage.

Any car not starting from the start line within 20 seconds after the start signal will be considered as retired and immediately moved to a safe place.

## 12.5 Refuelling

Vital Equipment will be in attendance in the refuelling zone, to supply Carless Hiperflo Turbo Ultimate and Super Unleaded. Fuel must be pre-ordered from Vital Equipment on 01981 241169 or by email: <a href="mailto:info@vitalequipment.co.uk">info@vitalequipment.co.uk</a>

## 12.5.1 Refuelling Zone (RZ)

Refuelling is only allowed in Refuelling Zone (RZ) and commercial fuel station. To refuel in the service park is forbidden at any time. Self-Refuel can only be undertaken in the designated location within the refuel zone.

## 12.5.2 Access RZ

To access a Refuelling Zone, all personnel involved in refuelling operations must wear clothing that provides adequate protection against fire and includes at least: long trousers, long-sleeved top, closed shoes, gloves and a balaclava.

#### 12.5.3 Environmental Mat in a Refuelling Zone (RZ)

The organisers will protect the ground with an Environmental Mat.

#### 12.6 Rejoining

A crew which has failed to complete a leg and wish to restart on a subsequent leg must inform the Secretary of the Rally or Entries Secretary

The competitor must advise the organisers of the reason for the retirement (e.g. accident, technical problems, etc.) and the intention to have the car re-scrutineered and re-start the event. This shall apply to any crew which has been classified on the grounds of exceeding the time limit or has failed to visit a control but shall NOT APPLY where a crew has been disqualified for breach of eligibility requirements, traffic infringements or by decision of the Stewards. Any crew which has failed to complete a leg can only re-start the rally from the start of a subsequent leg or Service Out Control.

Crews who have retired and wish to restart must present their cars for scrutineering checks at a time and location agreed with the Scrutineers before the start time of the first car on the following leg. Contact numbers will be provided in a bulletin.

The car must retain its original body shell and engine block.

All crews which re-start, will have time penalties applied. This penalty will be calculated as a stage maximum plus one minute for each Stage or Super Special Stage missed, which shall include the Special Stage or Super Special Stage on which the crew retired. Amending GR R32-2(a)(i).

Should retirement occur after the last Special Stage of the leg the crew will nevertheless be deemed to have missed that Stage.

Any crew not wishing to re-start must inform the Organisers of their retirement from the event and the reason for so doing. This can be done by email/text message or by completing the form enclosed with your paperwork and handing it in to the organisers with their timecards.

To be classified as a finisher a time must be recorded at MTC4.

## 12.7 Finish procedures and other activities after the finish of the rally

## 12.7.1 Finish Ceremony

There will be a specific finish procedure. A finished ceremony will be held at the Final Time Control in Lockerbie Mart. All finishing crews and cars will be arranged in the finish area, prior to crossing the finish ramp, and the Top 3 Overall Crews in the Event, the winner of each category of the British Historic Rally Championship and Top 3 2WD Crews, and others as may be outlined by the event organisers, will be required to attend the Finish Podium Ceremony.

## 12.7.2 Availability of participants

In accordance with GR H.32.1.6., participants upon passing the finish line, must remain available by phone (mobile) until the final classification has been posted.

## 12.7.3 Classification

The final classification will not be distributed after the event. The final classification will be published on the Digital Notice Board.

## 12.8 Official time used during the rally

Official time will be GMT / Greenwich Meant Time. All clocks will be set to BBC / British Telecom time. Rally time can be checked at <a href="https://www.time.is">www.time.is</a>

#### 12.9 Damage Declaration Form

Upon completion of the event at the final time control, or upon retirement, competitors will be required to complete and sign their damage declaration form at the rear of the timecards, in accordance with GR R.40.1.3. This form refers to any third party damage the competitor may have contributed to during all sections of the rally.

Information given will not incur a penalty, but failure to disclose details of any such incident, or failure to hand in a duly completed form will be penalised in accordance with GR R.32.2. Competitors who do not report to the finish of the event or hand the form in to an official, are required to forward the report to the organiser's representative / Secretary of the Meeting within 72 hours of the finish of the event [GR R.40.1.4.]

Competitors who fail to comply may receive a fine of up to £100. Competitors involved in an accident MUST give details to the organisers the same day.

#### 12.10 Judges of Fact

Named Judges of Fact, appointed by the organisers, will be on duty throughout the rally to observe and report in any competitor considered to be in contravention of Motorsport UK GR R24.7, R24.8.

A list of persons acting as Judge of Fact will be published on the Digital notice board per GR G10.2

#### 15. Final checks

#### 15.1 Final Checks

Time and location: see programme (SR. Art. 3)

Any teams required to undergo final scrutineering must immediately follow the instruction of the marshals in charge, even if this prevents them from proceeding to one or more time controls (TC). The complete original Vehicle Passport (VP) / Competition Car Log Book (CCLB), FIA homologation form (where applicable), Historic Rally Vehicle Identification Form (HRVIF) /

Historic Technical Passport (HTP) (where applicable), and other necessary certifications must be available for final scrutineering. A representative of the competitor as well as mechanics with the appropriate tools (in case of dismantling) must be present at the final scrutineering.

## 16. Protests and Appeals

16.1 Protests and appeals are in accordance with Motorsport UK GRs.

Provisional results will be published as soon as possible after the finish of each event.

Any teams required to undergo Competitors shall ensure that they and their cars are available for inspection should a protest be submitted in accordance with Motorsport UK GR C5.2.2. If the protested vehicle is not available for inspection the competitor may be penalised in accordance with Motorsport UK GR C3.2

## 17. Sustainability

As event organisers, we are fully aware of the environmental concerns that surround all sports - not just motorsport - and as such, we endeavour to have a responsible approach to sustainability and the environment.

The governing bodies are in the process of discussing with the exceptional engineering community that exists within motorsport to identify and develop technology to combat climate change. They are also establishing targets for all Motorsport UK clubs and events to be part of the Environmental Sustainability Accreditation and engaging with stakeholders to educate on calculation of carbon footprint, reduction strategies and offsetting.

We are aware of the natural beauty of the countryside and environments that we utilise to facilitate the sport you enjoy. We are looking at every conceivable option to improve the events' environmental credentials and carbon footprint.


List and positioning of advertising

# Appendix 4 – Extracts from Motorsport UK Yearbook relating to overalls, helmets and any other safety requirements.

GR R.5.3. In conjunction with scrutiny of the car, Drivers' and Co-Drivers' crash helmets, FHR Devices, and overalls must be produced for approval.

GR R.25.3.1. All crew members must wear a crash helmet bearing a Motorsport UK approval sticker (K.10.1 to K.10.3.1) and a safety belt throughout any Special Stage.

GR R.25.3.2. The crew must also wear flame resistant overalls homologated to FIA 8856-2000, FIA 8856-2018 or FIA 1986 Standard, and balaclavas to FIA 8856-2000 or FIA 8856-2018 Standard. Competitors are also strongly advised to wear Flame Resistant gloves, socks, and underwear. Plastic shoes (such as trainers) should be avoided. Attention is drawn to (K.9.1.5 to K.9.3).

GR R.25.3.3. The crew must also wear FIA approved FHR Devices, fitted in accordance with K.10.4.

## Appendix 5 – Safety Tracking

Art. 11.2.6 TRACKERS - SUPPLY, FITTING AND RETURN

#### 1 TRACKER FITTING

In association with RBI Sport Geotraq, the rally will operate a mandatory GPRS/GSM safety tracking system that will enable the speed and position of each competing vehicle to be monitored and logged. Tracker units will be provided as part of the entry fee and should be fitted by the competitor with guidance from the supplier, Geotraq, between sound check and scrutineering on Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> November. Competitors / Service Crews will be guided and assisted in the fitting, so they are familiar with how it is done in order to facilitate the subsequent removal at the end of the event.

The Tracker is fitted by means of a bracket which is tightened around the roll cage on the co-driver's side of the vehicle. A USB-C connection wire is connected to the device which is linked to a remote SOS button (if issued). This wire should be tie-wrapped to the roll cage and the remote SOS button attached to the Driver's door panel or a reachable location on the Driver's side of the vehicle using velcro or similar. There is no requirement for a 12v feed direct from the battery into the cockpit on the co-driver's side with an inline 6 amp fuse on the positive connection. All necessary fittings for the tracker unit are supplied and can be fixed in place by Geotraq, but competitors / service crews can assist in the attachment of the clamp fitting and should so the feeding /attaching of the remote SOS wire/button, to ensure it does not interfere with any of the vehicles other cabling and / or fittings and is within reach at all times while belted into the seat.

#### 2 TRACKER OPERATION

The Geotraq tracker includes SOS, OK, Hazard and Overtake functions plus the driver has access to a remote SOS button. All competitors MUST familiarise themselves with the tracker and its operation prior to the event.



SOS	Alerts Rally Control of the requirement for emergency response and alerts approaching competitors
Hazard	Alerts approaching competitors of a potential blockage / danger and notifies Rally Control
Overtake	Alerts competitor ahead that following vehicle wishes to overtake (request and response recorded for Rally Control)



#### 3 TRACKER RETURN

Trackers, attachments and all cabling will be collected prior to MC4 the Final Control. If the competitor does not attend the Final Control, it is their responsibility to ensure that the tracker, attachments and all cabling are returned to Geotraq personnel at the collection point or at Rally HQ as soon as possible.

Should you retire from the event, please return your tracking device to Geotraq personnel at Rally HQ as soon as possible. Failure to return the tracker or returning the tracker in a damaged state will result in financial penalties outlined in the document "DAMAGE / NON-RETURN CHARGES FOR GPS/SATELLITE TRACKING EQUIPMENT" on the Digital Notice Board, and payment taken either in cash or from the "Paper Deposit Form".

If the tracking device is not returned or payment has not been made to the supplier for loss or damage, the crew will be reported to Motorsport UK under Article C.1.1.13 and your competition licences will be suspended until payment is made or the undamaged tracking device is returned. In accordance with Motorsport UK Stage Rally Safety Requirements non-return of a unit will be treated as per failure to hand in damage declaration (R40.1.3)


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
